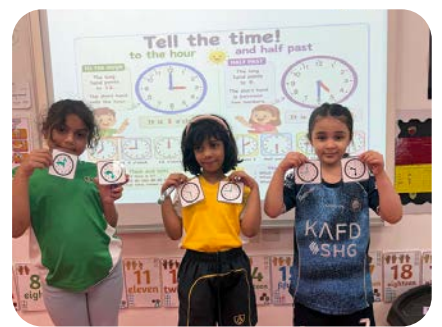
It has been wonderful to see the confidence, independence, and progress each child has developed through their learning, and we are incredibly proud of all they have accomplished.



**CELEBRATING MILESTONES, INSPIRING YOUNG MINDS**

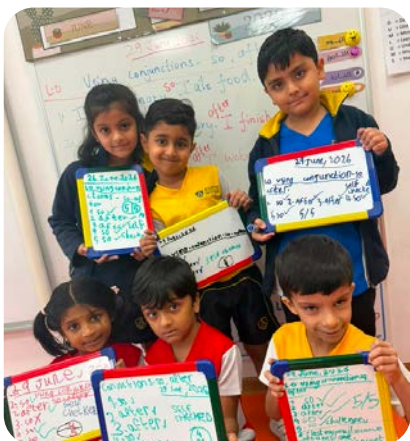
Our Year 1 children continued to make excellent progress in their learning. In English, they explored the conjunctions so and after to join ideas in their writing. They also explored the story Little People, BIG DREAMS: Mary Anning, made thoughtful predictions, practised sentence building, and developed their reading fluency through a range of classroom activities.

In Maths, the children strengthened their understanding of o'clock and half past through practical, hands-on activities and games, building confidence in telling the time.



The children in Year 2 enjoyed a week full of energy and imagination. In Spelling, they explored words ending in -ment and -ness, discovering how root words can be transformed into new vocabulary. One of the highlights was finishing The BFG. The class was captivated by the story and thoroughly enjoyed every moment of the reading journey.

In Maths, we revisited key concepts from across the year, consolidating their learning and building confidence as they prepare for the next stage of their learning journey.



**EQUIPPING LEARNERS WITH KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND VALUES**

Throughout week, students strengthened their English skills through handwriting, grammar, and structured writing activities. In Mathematics, they consolidated the four operations, practised explaining their mathematical thinking, and enjoyed an interactive Blooket revision challenge.

In Science, students reviewed key concepts and reflected on practical investigations completed throughout the term. Humanities lessons focused on the achievements of significant historical figures while making meaningful links to writing. Students also enhanced their literacy through spelling games and general knowledge activities.

In Arabic, they reviewed key learning through interactive games and quizzes, while in Islamic Education, they explored cooperation, reinforced their knowledge of the Prophets, and learned about the significance of Muharram and 'Ashura through engaging activities.





**PREPARING FUTURE-READY LEARNERS**

This week, KS3 students took part in a range of activities across the curriculum. They explored important Islamic values and events, strengthened their vocabulary and communication skills through spelling games and general knowledge activities, and revised key Arabic concepts through interactive tasks and quizzes. Students also investigated mathematical contributions from different cultures, developing their research skills while gaining a greater appreciation of the role of mathematics around the world.





**MOVING, SMILING, AND GROWING STRONGER EVERY DAY!**

Supporting healthy habits both in and out of school helps students develop the confidence, resilience, and wellbeing they need to thrive. Looking after their physical, emotional, and social wellbeing is an important part of this journey.
